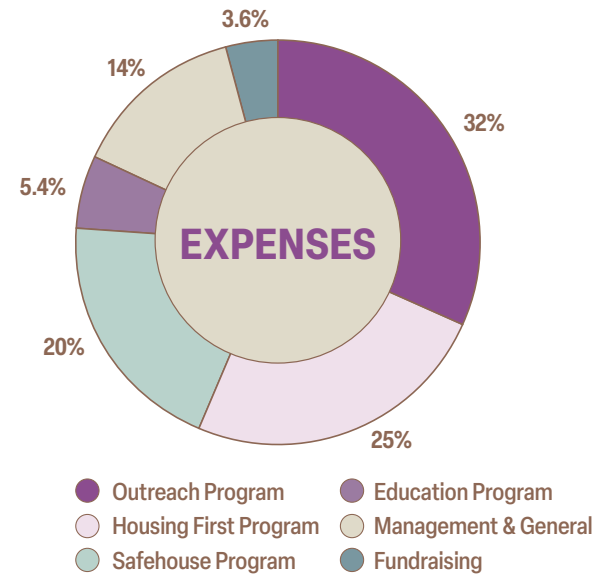
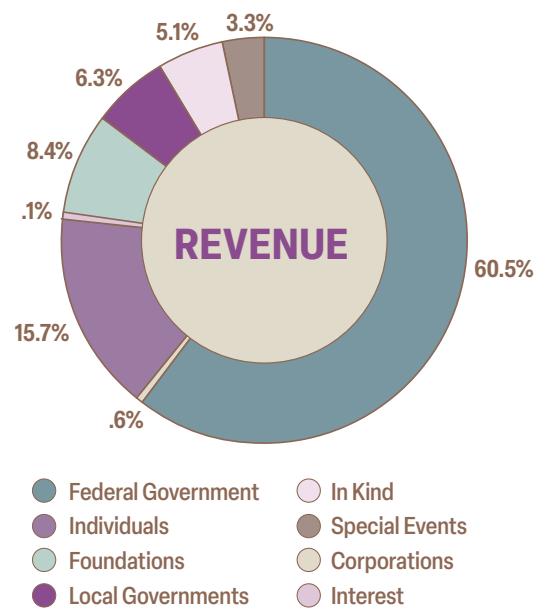

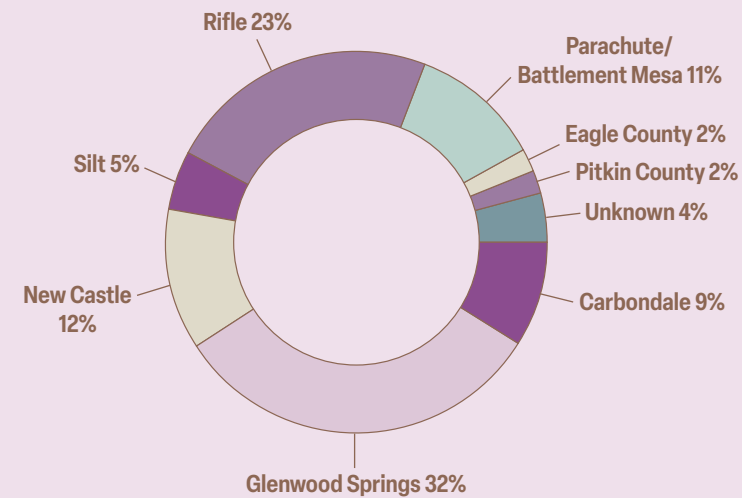

6 meetings were held with the Garfield County Domestic Violence Coalition.

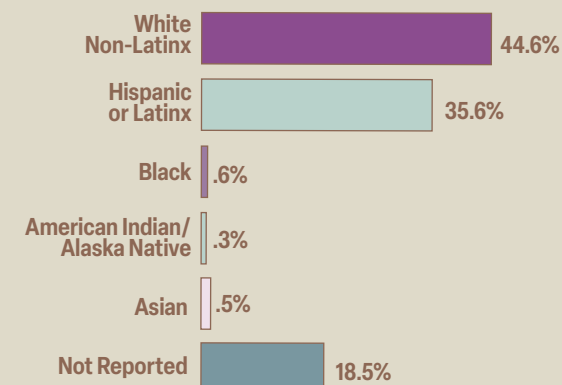

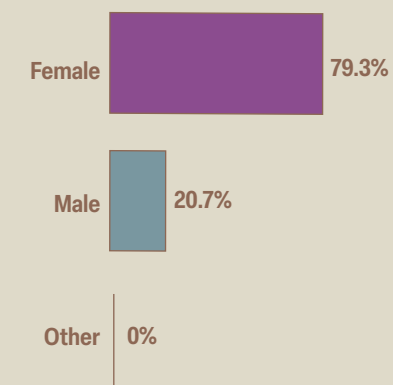

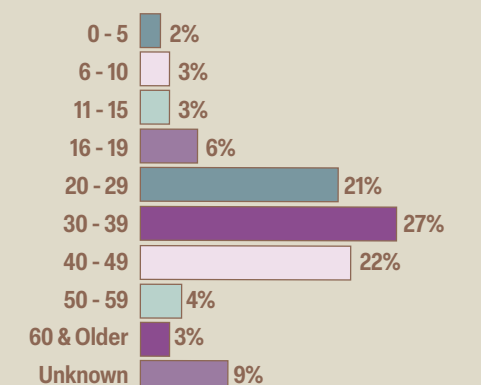

BROADENING OUR CULTURAL HORIZONS

OUR FAVORITE FUNDRAISING STORY

Mike Bagley, a youngster from Rifle, pulled on our heartstrings when he took it upon himself to help those less fortunate than himself. Prompted by a school project asking children how they would spend \$100 if given the opportunity, a kindergartner at the time, young Mr. Bagley said he would buy food for the hungry—and he did just that. He also harnessed the power of social media to expand his reach. As a result, he collected over \$1,800 worth of items as well as a check for \$500, all of which he donated to ASP in March 2022. LUNAFEST 2022 HIGHLIGHT REEL

- **We hosted 4 LUNAFEST showings—1 virtual, 2 at Hotel Colorado, and 1 at Ute Theater;**
- **Sold a total of 477 tickets; with sponsor and volunteer comp tickets, over 500 people attended LUNAFEST 2022;**
- **And, we raised over \$28,000!**
- **Noteworthy Film: Former area resident, Cassandra Rochelle Fetter, debuted her short film called Breathe which shined a spotlight on the trauma of intimate partner violence.**
- **New in 2022: During LUNAFEST at Hotel Colorado, Glenwood Springs Center for the Arts hosted an exhibit that featured the work of women artists depicting themes related to the films. At the Ute Theater in Rifle, locals came out in support of LUNAFEST with music by girlband the Queen Bees, and food provided by several area restaurants.**

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, JULIE OLSON 2022 ATHENA AWARD WINNER



The Glenwood Springs Chamber Foundation recognized Executive Director, Julie Olson with the prestigious 2022 Athena Award. The accolade recognizes local women leaders who give back and serve as role models in their communities. For more than 27 years, Olson has dedicated her life to advocating for women affected by domestic and sexual violence. She has played an integral role in the creation of many events that support and educate about women's issues including Colorado Gives Day, Sexual Assault Nurse Examination (SANE) programming, LUNAFEST, and others. During her tenure, it is estimated that Olson has directly or indirectly assisted approximately 10,140 women.
